Is it a Robot or is it an Alien?!

US Terms Beginner Friendly!

You Will Need:

- Yarn in weight of your choice and hook size to match.
- Polyfil Stuffing.
- Darning Needle
- Scissors
- *Optional-Safety Eyes in size of your choice. I personally went for an oversized eye look, but this is really up to your own personal preference.



Needing Approx. 80yds of a
single color
or

.Approx. 60yds in gray
Approx. 10yds in teal if
making Gir

Along with a scrap amount of
black for stitching the mouth.

You can use any weight yarn and hook for
this critter. I've listed below some examples
of what I've used.

- 2 Ply Herschnerrs Afghan Yarn w/
2.25mm Hook
- Bernat Baby Velvet w/ 4mm hook
- Double Stranded Baby Velvet and
Worsted Weight w/ 5mm hook

Stitches to Know:

- FR - Foundation Ring
- HdcFR - Half Double Crochet Foundation Ring
- Fsc - Foundation Single Crochet
- Sc - Single Crochet
- HDC - Half Double Crochet
- R3L - Rear 3rd Loop, created when using HDC
- Inc - Increase
- Dec - Decrease
- HDCInc - Half Double Crochet Increase
- St - Stitch
- F/O - Finish Off

Working in continuous rounds and stuffing as you go.

Body & Head - For either version, starting from the bottom with your main body color.

1. FR 6 (Alternatively you can use a MR or Ch.2 start)
2. HDCinc x6 (12)
3. In R3L, Sc around (12)
- 4-8. Sc around (12)
9. Dec x6 (6)
- 10-11. Sc around
12. Inc x6 (12)
13. (Sc, Inc) x6 (18)
14. Sc around
15. Sc, Inc. (Sc 2, Inc) x5, Sc (24)
- 16-18. Sc around
19. (Sc 3, Inc) x6 (30)
- 20-22. Sc around
23. HDC around (30)

When stuffing your pieces, place the edge that is meant to stay flat against a flat surface so you don't cause a bulge and the area stays flat.

If using safety eyes, attach them between rounds 19& 20 roughly 4-5sts apart. There are instructions further into the pattern for alternative crocheted eyes for Gir.

24. R3L (Sc 3, Dec) x6 (24)
25. Sc, Dec. (Sc 2, Dec) x5, Sc (18)
26. (Sc, Dec) x6 (12)

F/O and leave tail to close the head. Weave tail through the front loops and pull tight to close. Weave in your end.

Hands/Arms x2 *Ch. 1 does NOT count as a stitch* If making

Gir, continue with gray to start

1. Fsc 1
2. Ch. 1, Inc (2)
3. Ch. 1 & Turn, Sc 2
4. Ch. 1 & Turn, with a looser tension for this row, Inc x2 (4)

Continuous rounds from here

5. Ch. 1 & Work into the 1st Sc from Row 4 to form a ring, Sc 4 (4)
- 6-9. Sc around.
10. Inc x4 (8)
11. Sc around

For Gir, at the end of round 9 change to your teal color. You can do this as well if you chose to have a secondary color for your robot.

F/O and leave tail for sewing. Weave tail through front loops and pull tight to close. Do NOT cut yarn! Use remaining yarn tail to also attach arm to your body.

Legs x2 - With your main color (gray for Gir)

1. HdcFR 6
2. In R3L, Sc around (6)
3. Sc 4, Dec (5)
4. Sc 3, Dec (4)

F/o and leave a tail for sewing. Attach legs to the body.

Antenna - If making Gir, do your first round in teal then switch to gray for remaining rounds.

1. FR 4 (4)
- 2-5. Sc around (4)

F/o and leave a tail for sewing. Attach to center on top of head.

If you decided not to use safety eyes or followed the mods for Gir here is the alternative eyes.

"Gir"/Crocheted Eyes x2 - Start with teal yarn

1. FR 6
2. (HDC, HDCinc)x3 (9) Change to gray
3. In R3L, Sc around (9)
4. Sc around (9)

Add a small amount of stuffing to help keep shape.

5. (Sc, Dec)x3 (6)

F/o and leave tail for sewing. Attach your eyes to the head.

With your small bit of scrap black yarn.
Stitch a mouth to your new buddy!

You're Alien Robot (or Gir) is
FINISHED!
