US Terms Intermediate Level

You Will Need

- Yarn weight of your choosing -Hank in the photo is made using Worsted Weight yarn,
 - Worsted Weight Yarn Amounts Main Color approx. 600yds, Secondary Color approx. 100yds.
- Hook to match your chosen yarn that will allow you the tightest tension I
 use a 3.5mm hook when working with worsted weight.
- Stitch Markers
- *Optional: Safety Eyes. 24mm if using worsted weight.
- *Optional: Needle Felting Kit -this is my personal preferred method for the spots.
- Poly Fiberfil
- Pins of whatever kind for pinning parts into place before attaching

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Important infoll

- The main body is worked as one full piece. Starting from the bottom and working to complete the head.
- You will be working in both continuous rounds AND short rows with this project. Short rows are how I obtain the realistic looking curves.
- The legs are worked up in a way that it takes the "guess work" out of how they should be attached. Also giving them a more realistic look!

Work in Continuous Rounds

89. Sc 21, SISt 22, Sc 26 (69) - **Below Instructions/Photos are for this row ONLY**

When working back into the Round after Short Rows. Insert your hook into the unworked stitches, AND around the "post" of the Chain & Turn.







Continue down the edge as if you were adding a border, working into the side of Every Row..

When you get to the corner, work into the next Unworked Stitch! Do NOT work into the corner.





Work your Slip Stitches, then repeat the same going up the other side to the end of your Round.





90. Sc 2, Sc3Tog, Sc 14, Sc3Tog, Sc 20, Sc3Tog, Sc 14, Sc3Tog, Sc 3, Dec, Sc 2 (60)

When working with Slip Stitches in the Round. You want to crochet Around the Stitch.

Basically into the same space you placed the Slip Stitch.



- 4. Ch. 1, Sc 6 across bottom
- 5. Ch. 1, Fold in half, Going through both sides, Sc 3 to close.

Cut some strands of your Secondary Color and attach to the open Front Loops created in rounds 2&3.



You did it! You made all the pieces! Now lets put him together!

I hope you find the photos below helpful in how to pin and attach your pieces to your body.

Due to the shaping on the arms and legs, it's pretty straightforward on where to attach your parts. Pretty much just line up your edges with the body and Go!

You will need to stuff each arm/leg before you fully close them off







Now that your Giraffe is put together, it's time for spots!! How you choose to do your spots is entirely up to you. Be it Fabric Paint, Crocheted, or as I myself chose to do, Needle Felted.

I didn't have a plan for my spots, just placed them where I thought they looked good.

You can find a link to the stencil I made at the start of the pattern if you choose to needle felt.



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
