US Terms

Intermediate-Advanced Level

Using Yarn Over/Yarn Over method

You Will Need

- Worsted (4) Weight Yarn in 2 colors of your choosing.
 - Approx. 800yds main color & 200yds secondary color.
 - I'm using Lion Brand Pound of Love for the body color. And then a skein of Red Heart Stripes or similar style for the hair.
- 3.5mm Hook
- FiberFil
- Stitch Markers
- Mystic Add On Bundle
 - Includes Hooves, Horn, Eyes, and Hinges
 - *Find Bundle available on Etsy*
 - MUST HAVE hooves at the very least

Stitches to Know

St(s) - Stitch(s)

FR - Foundation Ring (used in place of MR)

Fsc - Foundation Single Crochet (used in place of a chain)

SlSt - Slip Stitch

SkSt - Skip Stitch

Ch - Chain

Ch&T - Chain and Turn

Sc - Single Crochet

Inc - Increase/Sc 2 in same stitch

Dec - Decrease/Sc 2 stitches together

Sc3Tog - Sc 3 stitches together

When reading:

- "Sc 3" etc. = Sc 1 in each of the next 3sts.
- "3sc" etc. = 3 Sc into the same st.

You will find yourself working in Continuous Rounds, along with Short Rows. Everything will be clearly marked and stated where/what is to happen. It is very important to pay attention to the instructions and stitch counts as you make this project.

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The start of this critter begins with the legs. All 4 legs are begun and worked the same for a certain number of rounds. Pay close attention to when and where you'll be changing things for each leg.
Stuff as you Go!

Find the center hole on the rear of your hoof and attach your yarn.

Pay attention to the L/R marked on your hooves, this will play into the directions later.

Starting in the next hole from where you attached your yarn.

1. Inc, Sc 6, Inc, Sc 3, Inc, Sc 6, Inc, Sc. Your last stitch will be in the same hole you attached your yarn in. [24]

2-3. Sc Around. [24] - *2 Rounds Total*

4. Sc, Dec, Sc 19, Dec. [22]

5. Sc, Dec, Sc 17, Dec. [20]

6. Sc, Dec, Sc 15, Dec. [18]

7-11. Sc Around. [18] - *5 Rounds Total*

12. Inc x6, Sc 12. [24]

Short Rows - Turning Chains to NOT count as a stitch here and throughout pattern -

13. Sc 12 -STOP-

14. Ch&T, Sc 12.

15. Ch&T, Sc 10. PM, new End of Round.

Continuous Rounds

16. Sc 4, SlSt 8, Sc 12. [24]

17-19. Sc Around. [24] - *3 Rounds*

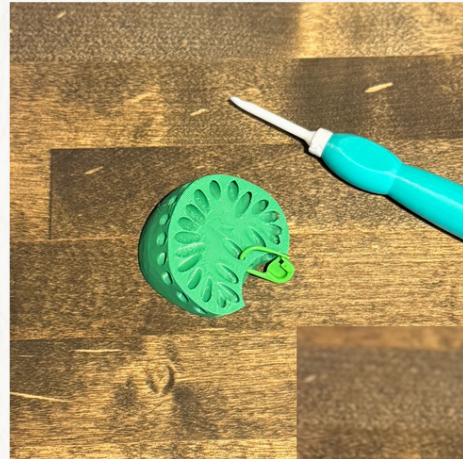

20. Sc 2, Dec, (Sc 4, Dec)x3, Sc 2.

21-28. Sc Around. [20] - *8 Rounds*

Here is where we will now break off to do the Front and Rear legs. Continue on below to complete your front legs.
If you've made it to working your rear legs, please jump ahead to the next part of the pattern.

Front Legs

29. Sc 6, (Sc, Inc)x4, Sc 6. [24]

Short Rows

30. Sc 20. -STOP-

31. Ch&T, Sc 16.

32. Ch&T, Sc 14.

33. Ch&T, Sc 12.

34. Ch&T, Sc 10. PM, new End of Round.

Continuous Rounds

35. Sc 4, SlSt 8, Sc 12. [24]

36-38. Sc Around. [24] - *3 Rounds Total*

39. Sc 9, Inc, Sc 11, Inc, Sc 2. [26]

40-42. Sc Around. [26] - *3 Rounds Total*

43. Sc 10, Inc, Sc 11, Inc, Sc 3. [28]

44-46. Sc Around. [28] - *3 Rounds Total*

47. (Sc 12, Inc)x2, Sc 2. [30]

48-50. Sc Around. [30] - *3 Rounds Total*



Here you'll need to remember which side hoof you started your leg with.

51. For Left Leg: Sc 3. -STOP- / For Right Leg: Sc 16. - STOP-

52. Ch&T, Sc 22.

53. Ch&T, Sc 20.

54. Ch&T, Sc 18.

55. Ch&T, Sc 16.

56. Ch&T, Sc 14.

57. Ch&T, Sc 12.

58. Ch&T, Sc 10.

59. Ch&T, Sc 8.

60. Ch&T, Sc 6.

61. Ch&T, Sc 4. PM, new End of Round.



Determine here if you'll be adding hinges or going without.

Finishing the front leg!

Continuous Rounds

From here you have 2 options on how to finish. You can simply do a single round of Sc [30] and finish off leaving a tail to sew onto the body, or add the hinge piece for movable front legs. For attaching hinge continue below.

62. Working through both the leg AND into the hinge, Sc around.
Before fully closing, make sure to finish stuffing the leg. [30]

63. (Sc 3, Dec) x6. [24]

64. Sc, Dec. (Sc 2, Dec) x5, Sc. [18]

65. (Sc, Dec) x6. [12]

Finish Off, leaving a small tail to close. Weave tail through front loops and pull tight to close around the post. Weave your end.



Set your front legs aside for now and begin working on rear legs!
Going back to starting with the hoof and working through to round 28.
Continue on below at round 29.

29. (Sc 9, Inc) x2. [22]

30 - 31. Sc Around. [22] - *2 Rounds Total*

32. Sc 10, Inc x2, Sc 10. [24]

33 - 34. Sc Around. [24] - *2 Rounds Total*

35. Inc x4, Sc 18, Inc x2. [30]

Short Rows

36. Sc 13 -STOP-

37. Ch&T, Sc 22.

38. Ch&T, Sc 20.

39. Ch&T, Sc 18.

40. Ch&T, Sc 16. PM, new End of Round.



Continuous Rounds

41. Sc 4, SlSt 8, Sc 18. [30]
- 42-46. Sc Around. [30] - *5 Rounds Total*
47. Sc 9, Inc x2, Sc 19. [32]
48. Sc 9. (Sc, Inc) x2, Sc 19. [34]
49. Sc 10, Inc, Sc 2, Inc, Sc 20. [36]
50. Sc Around. [36]

Here you'll need to remember which side hoof you started your leg with.

Determine here if you'll be adding hinges or going without.

51. For Left Leg: Sc 19 -STOP- / For Right Leg: -STOP-
52. Ch&T, Sc 28.
53. Ch&T, Sc 26.
54. Ch&T, Sc 24.
55. Ch&T, Sc 22.
56. Ch&T, Sc 20.
57. Ch&T, Sc 18.
58. Ch&T, Sc 16.
59. Ch&T, Sc 14.
60. Ch&T, Sc 12.
61. Ch&T, Sc 10.
62. Ch&T, Sc 8.
63. Ch&T, Sc 6. PM, new End of Round.



Finishing Rear Leg!

Continuous Rounds

From here you have 2 options on how to finish. You can simply do a single round of Sc [36] and finish off leaving a tail to sew onto the body, or add the hinge piece for movable rear legs. For attaching hinge continue below.

64. Sc 2, Dec. (Sc 4, Dec) x5, Sc 2. [30]
65. Working through both the leg AND into the hinge, Sc around. Before fully closing, make sure to finish stuffing the leg. [30]
66. (Sc 3, Dec) x6. [24]
67. Sc, Dec. (Sc 2, Dec) x5, Sc. [18]
68. (Sc, Dec) x6. [12]

Finish Off, leaving a small tail to close. Weave tail through front loops and pull tight to close around the post. Weave your end.

Legs are Finished!

Set your legs aside for now. From here we will begin working on the body. The body is worked from the bottom up to the neck. If you chose to end your legs with the hinges, they will be attached as you work the body.

 3. (Sc, Inc) x6. [18]
 4. Sc, Inc. (Sc 2, Inc) x5, Sc. [24]
 5. (Sc 3, Inc) x6. [30]
 6. Sc 2, Inc. (Sc 4, Inc) x5, Sc 2. [36]
 7. (Sc 5, Inc) x6. [42]
 8. Sc 3, Inc. (Sc 6, Inc) x5, Sc 3. [48]
 9. (Sc 7, Inc) x6. [54]
 10. Sc 4, Inc. (Sc 8, Inc) x5, Sc 4. [60]
 11. (Sc 9, Inc) x6. [66]
 12. Sc 5, Inc. (Sc 10, Inc) x5, Sc 5. [72]
 13. (Sc 11, Inc) x6. [78]
 - 14-17. Sc Around. [78] - *4 Rounds Total*
 18. Sc 24, Ch.1&SkSt, Sc 28, Ch.1&SkSt, Sc 24. [78]
- PM into the SkSt for easy finding of the spaces later.

- 19 - 21. Sc Around. [78] - *3 Rounds Total*
22. (Sc 11, Dec) x6. [72]
23. Sc 5, Dec. (Sc 10, Dec) x5, Sc 5. [66]
24. (Sc 9, Dec) x6. [60]
25. Sc 4, Dec. (Sc 8, Dec) x5, Sc 4. [54]

With the end of your round facing you. Attach Rear legs to appropriate sides of the body in the marked Ch.1 spaces from round 18. Skip if you've chosen to sew on your legs, but leave the markers for now.



- 26 - 40. Sc Around. [54] - *15 Rounds Total*
41. Sc 25, (Inc, Sc 5) x2, Inc, Sc 16. [57]
- 42 - 43. Sc Around. [57] - *2 Rounds Total*
44. Sc 27, (Inc, Sc 6) x2, Inc, Sc 15. [60]
- 45 - 50. Sc Around. [60] - *6 Rounds Total*
51. Sc 26, Dec, (Sc 2, Dec)x5, Sc 12. [54]
52. Sc Around. [54]

Short Rows

- 53. Sc 48 -STOP-
- 54. Ch& T, Sc 27.
- 55. Ch& T, Sc 24.
- 56. Ch& T, Sc 21.
- 57. Ch& T, Sc 18.
- 58. Ch& T, Sc 15.
- 59. Ch& T, Sc 12. PM, new End of Round.



Continuous Rounds

60. Sc 3, Dec, Sc 2, Ch.1&SkSt, Sc 3, Dec, SlSt 18, Dec, Sc 4, Ch.1&SkSt, Sc, Dec, Sc 4, Dec, Sc 5, Dec. [48] PM into SkSt for easy finding of the spaces later.



61-68. Sc Around. [48] - *8 Rounds Total*
Attach your arms to the appropriate sides of the body in the previously marked Ch.1 Spaces. Skip if you've chosen to sew on your arms, but leave the markers for now.

- 69. Sc 3, Dec, (Sc 6, Dec) x5, Sc 3. [42]
- 70-77. Sc Around. [42] - *8 Rounds Total*



Short Rows

- 78. Sc 33 -STOP-
- 79. Ch& T, Sc 24.
- 80. Ch& T, Sc 21.
- 81. Ch& T, Sc 18.
- 82. Ch& T, Sc 15.
- 83. Ch& T, Sc 12.
- 84. Ch& T, Sc 9.
- 85. Ch& T, Sc 6.
- 86. Ch& T, Sc 3. PM, new End of Round.



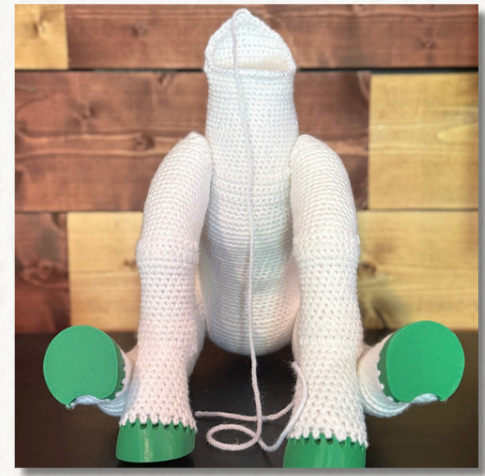
Continuous Rounds

87. Sc Around. [42]

Finish Off and leave a long tail for sewing.



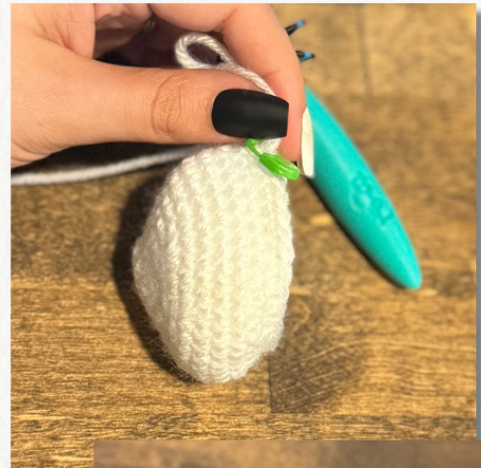
We have a Body!



With that done, we can now begin working on the head.

Head

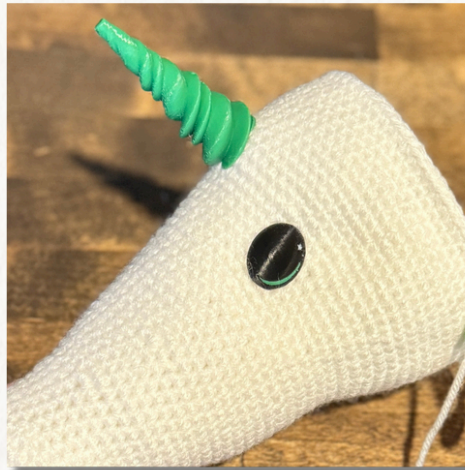

3. (Sc, Inc)x6. [18]
4. Sc, Inc. (Sc 2, Inc)x5, Sc. [24]
5. (Sc 3, Sc)x6. [30]
6. Sc 2, Inc. (Sc 4, Inc)x5, Sc 2. [36]
7. (Sc 5, Inc)x6. [42]
- 8-10. Sc Around. [42] - *3 Rounds Total*
11. Sc 5, Dec, Sc 9, (Dec, Sc 2)x3, Dec, Sc 9, Dec, Sc. [36]
12. Sc 5, Dec, Sc 7, (Dec, Sc)x3, Dec, Sc 8, Dec, Sc. [30].
- 13-17. Sc Around. [30] - *5 Rounds Total*
18. 3Sc, Sc 7, 3Sc, (Sc 6, Inc)x2, Sc 7. [36]
- 19-23. Sc Around. [36] - *5 Rounds Total*
24. Sc 2, 3Sc, Sc 9, 3Sc, Sc 8, Inc, Sc 6, Inc, Sc 7. [42]
- 25-29. Sc Around. [42] - *5 Rounds Total*
30. Sc 3, Inc, (Sc 6, Inc)x5, Sc 3. [48]
- 31-33. Sc Around. [48] - *3 Rounds Total*



34. (Sc 7, Inc)x6. [54]
35. Sc Around. [54]
36. Sc 6, Ch.1&SkSt, Sc 15, Ch.1&SkSt, Sc 31. [54] - PM in each SkSt, these are for your eyes later.
37. Sc Around. [54]
38. Sc 4, Inc, (Sc 8, Inc)x5, Sc 4. [60]
39. (Sc 9, Inc)x6. [66]
40. Sc 5, Inc, Sc 10, Inc, Ch.1&SkSt, Sc 9, Inc, (Sc 10, Inc)x3, Sc 5. [72] - PM in SkSt, this is for your horn later.
- 41-50. Sc Around. [72] - 10 Rounds Total



Pause here and attach both your eyes and your horn into the previously marked spaces.



51. Sc 2, Dec, (Sc 4, Dec)x11, Sc 2. [60]
 52. (Sc 3, Dec)x12. [48]
 53. Sc, Dec, (Sc 2, Dec)x11, Sc. [36]
 54. Sc 2, Dec, (Sc 4, Dec)x5, Sc 2. [30]
 55. (Sc 3, Dec)x6. [24]
 56. Sc, Dec, (Sc 2, Dec)x6, Sc. [18]
 57. (Sc, Dec)x6. [12]
- F/O. Finish stuffing head and weaving through the front loops of your final round, close off.



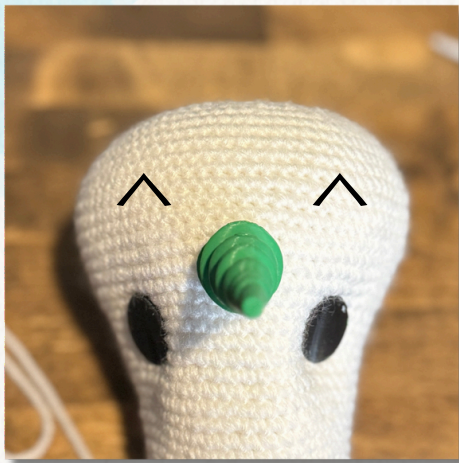
Take a couple long pieces of yarn and do some shaping on the eyes, and pull in the nose together to create the nostrils.



Onto the final pieces!

Ears x2

1. FR 6
 2. (Sc, Inc) x3. [9]
 3. (Sc 2, Inc)x3. [12]
 4. (Sc 3, inc)x3. [15]
 5. (Sc 4, Inc)x3. [18]
 6. (Sc 5, Inc)x3. [21]
 - 7-13. Sc Around. [21] - *7 Rounds Total*
 14. (Sc, Dec)x7. [14]
 15. Pinch closed, Sc 7 across working through BOTH sides to close.
- F/O and leave tail for sewing.



Attach ears to top of the head on either side of and slightly behind the horn. I personally prefer to attach in a V shape as shown to keep the pointed look.

Determine how you want your head to rest on the neck. I personally go for a more natural down pointed look. Attach head to the rest of the body.



Nearly Finished!

Making the Mane

Most other patterns out there will have you making and attaching curls individually, I however despise this approach as it is very time consuming. Instead I make my mane and tail each as their own solid piece to be attached as a whole. No more curly headaches!

OR

Mane

1. FSc 30.
2. (Pull up a long loop, 12in long+. Using your hook, or finger, you'll want to twist your loop until it's nice and tight and starting to curl in on itself. From there, into the FLO work a SISt into the same St. Then SISt again into the next st.) repeat () across.

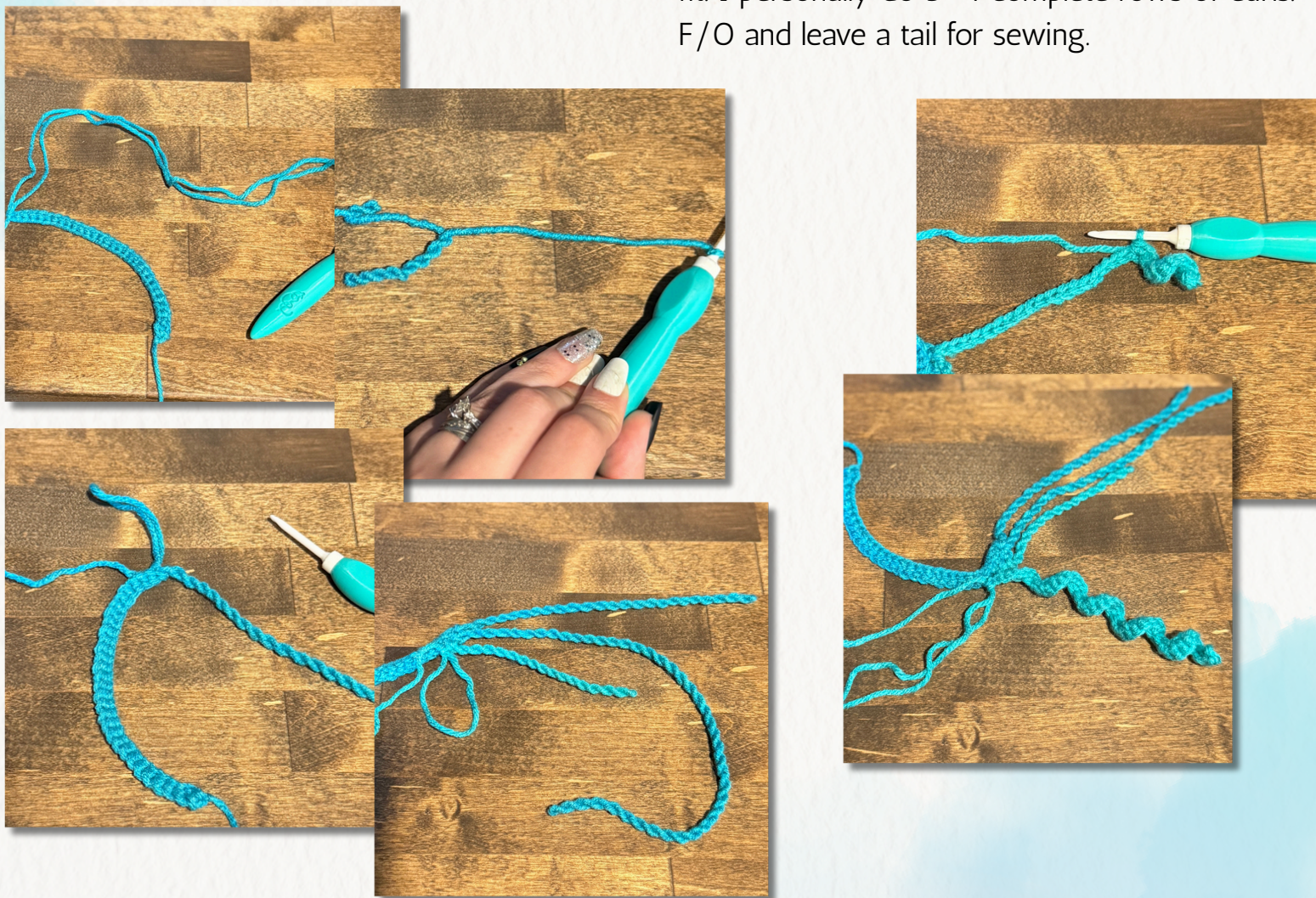
The length of the loop you pull will determine the length of your curl.

2. (Make a chain your desired length for a curl. Into each chain add 2Sc the entire length. From there, into the FLO work a SISt into the same St and then SISt again into the next st.) repeat () across.

3. Ch & T. In the BLO left open from the previous row, Sc across.

Repeat Rows 2&3 however many times you see fit. I personally do 3-4 complete rows of curls.

F/O and leave a tail for sewing.



I personally like to mix up the two types of curls in random spots for a more fun look. I also "go with my gut" on how long or short I make the curls. If you have or prefer a different way of doing your curls/mane, please feel free to do this part however you're comfortable!

Put a Tail on it!

The tail is done in a very similar way to the mane. However instead of Rows it's done in Rounds.

Tail

1. FR6
2. Inc x6, join to FLO 1st st with a SlSt. [12]
3. Choose which curl you would like to do.
Working around in the FLO complete your curls.
4. In the BLO left open from the previous round, (Sc, Inc)x6, SlSt to FLO of 1st st. [18]
5. Repeat Round 3

Continue in this manner with increasing by 6sts every Even round, and doing curls every Odd round until you're satisfied with the size of your tail.

*I personally only do 2 rounds of curls. And like with the mane, I alternate between the two style of curls.



You're officially done making pieces!

Attached both your mane and your tail to the head and body respectively.
